Are Garage Sales Allowed at Residences?

Yes. You are permitted to have up to <u>3</u> garage sales per year at the property where the <u>sale operator</u> resides and the sale may not exceed <u>two</u> consecutive days in length.

(See Section 3.9.3.M. of the Zoning Code)

Can Signs Be Displayed to Advertise Garage Sales?

Signs can only be placed on your property and cannot exceed a total of 12 square feet.

What is a Temporary Concession?

Any individual retail sales operation or distribution activity from a location not involving a permanent building for the purpose of housing or conducting sales, distributions or transactions, to make goods or services available to the general public using a temporary table, stand, cart, or similar equipment

(See Section 7.3 of the Zoning Code)

Where are Temporary Concessions Permitted?

Temporary concessions on private property are permitted within the following zones and are subject to the approval of the zoning administrator through a temporary concession stand permit:

- Shopping Center Zone
- Light Commercial Zone
- General Commercial Zone
- Auto Commercial Zone
- Travel Commercial Zone
- Recreation Zone
- All Industrial Zones
- All Mixed-Use Zones

Is it permissible to sell food at a temporary concession?

No, the vending of food products is regulated separately and requires a conditional use permit. However, mobile vending vehicles licensed and operated pursuant to the provisions of the Sacramento County Code do not constitute a temporary concession.
