What is Illegal Dumping?

Illegal Dumping occurs when a person places, deposits, dumps or accumulates refuse on or in any public or private street, public right-of way or easement, gutter or sidewalk, or any public or private property within the unincorporated area of the County.

(See section 6.20.130 of the Sacramento County Code)



The County may investigate an actionable report of illegal dumping. The County does not abate illegal dumping unless it's on a public right-of-way. Moving dumped items to the public right-of-way is an additional act of illegal dumping and may also be investigated.

Why is Illegal Dumping a Problem?

When illegal dumping occurs, the damage to neighborhoods and the environment can be severe:

- Property values decline.
- Unreported illegal dumping often results in more illegal dumping.
- Illegally dumped material can become a breeding ground for vectors, such as mice, rats and mosquitoes, which can spread diseases such as encephalitis, Hantavirus pulmonary syndrome and West Nile Disease.
- Illegal dumping is hazardous to the environment. From refrigerators to tires to auto parts to televisions, many contain heavy metals and other toxins.
- Illegal dumping piles pose a traffic hazard when left in the public right-of-way.



What is the County Doing to Combat Illegal Dumping?

The county has assembled a multi-agency and multidepartment team combat the problem. We have a zero



tolerance policy towards illegal dumpers anyone caught faces citation and arrest. Fines range from \$100 to \$1,000. Depending on the quantity of materials, the first and second offenses are typically prosecuted as an infraction. A third violation is typically pursued as misdemeanor.

How can You Help?

- Report it! Sacramento County rewards up to \$1,000 to those who witness illegal dumping and provide information leading to the adjudication of the illegal dumper. Call 311 or 916-875-4311 for details, or to report dumping.
 - Reward money is considered taxable income per the IRS. Recipients must fill out tax documents prior to receiving their reward.
- Properly dispose of your bulky waste by taking advantage of the Neighborhood Clean Up Service, which allows County residents to schedule one free pick-up per year, with additional pick-ups charged at the current rate. Call 916-875-5555 for details.
- Hire a specially licensed Junk & Rubbish Hauler, Call 916-874-6644 for details.
